




## PLANNING GUIDELINES

- Step 1: Begin Research
  - Create research questions.

  - Complete all pages in the packet <u>before</u> moving on to the next step.
- Step 2: Create your Google Slides Presentation
  - Write your notes into triple whammy format so that you
     can present your project in an interesting way.
  - You will need to include pictures and links.
  - Don't forget a bibliography slide (document where you found ALL your pictures and information).
- Step 3: Proofread with a partner
  - Work with a partner to practice presenting. Your
     partner should look for mistakes and provide feedback.




